"Lovely old vine complexity, it is not shouting fruit but discussing elegance. Excellent mineral, sawn terra cotta tiles, brick dust, red dust country roads, old vine black plum, black pepper, smoked meat fruit aromas. The fruit here is vivid raspberry, bouncing onto the front palate and settling so it's mid weighted for Barossa with excellent line and tannin extension, refined minerality in the flavours that lean into dusty road dust, baked clay and earth."

"From three dry-grown estate blocks planted between 1905 and '60; destemmed and open-fermented, pressed to new and used French and American hogsheads for completion of fermentation and 2 years maturation. 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2015 KALLESKE EDUARD SHIRAZ

97 Points

"The 2015 Kalleske Eduard Shiraz is from old vines from the Barossa Valley in South Australia. It screams out class the moment it is poured. An almost blackcoloured wine with garnet hues splaying prism-like against the glassware. Thorgerson and Hipgnosis would be inspired. The nose is evocative to say the least with wild and alluring black fruits that provide a solid foundation upon which there is no doubt about its ability to evolve into the future. Giving it plenty of air sees these black fruits mingling easily with the coffee beans, dark chocolate and mocha notes, herbs, spices and liquorice. The palate is clearly youthful and instantly appealing and immediately teasing with its layers of flavours much like waves crashing effortlessly against the shore. The tannins are firm, gripping, granular and velvety providing a textural platform that excites and extends the palate length to something just short of remarkable – little memory is required. All in all this is a wine with the structural components combining into a masterpiece that is a joy to taste now and for a very long time into the future. Hang in there!"
