2014 KALLESKE GREENOCK SHIRAZ

“Deep garnet-purple coloured, the 2014 Shiraz Greenock has a serious, rather broody nose with hints of black earth, chargrill and garrigue intermixed with blackberries, black cherries and mulberries plus a hint of Bovril. The full-bodied palate is taut and youthful still with a firm backbone of chewy tannins supporting the muscular, earthy fruit, finishing long with savory/mineral notes. It really needs another 3-4 years to open out and enjoy it over the next 10-12 years”.

“The Kalleske shiraz low-yield vineyard on the western edge of Greenock Creek in the north west of the Barossa Valley is highly prized by the sixth and seventh generations of the Kalleske family who tend it. On sandy loam over red clay and limestone – ideal for shiraz – the vines are from cuttings of shiraz planted in the late 1800s. The Greenock Barossa Valley Single Vineyard Shiraz 2014 is dense and dark red with purple tints, has perfumes of black plum, toast and coffee leading to a full bodied palate of blackberry and licorice into a lingering finish”.
