



## 2014 KALLESKE CLARRY'S GSM

The GSM stands for a blend of grenache, shiraz and mataro, with each aged in old oak for just six months. Complex aromas of raspberry, spice and musk notes and subtle fruitcake qualities. On the palate, raspberry and blackberry flavours are juicy, with slatey tannins adding structure in this opulent, rich red. Impressive value".*
