



## Kalleske 2005 Clarry's Barossa Red...

The bouquet shows raspberry, spice/pepper, dark chocolate and little char or aniseed, and what is probably a touch of oregano; so it goes from red through to black and into herb and of these aromas are followed fairly closely on the palate. Flavours are predominantly off-sweet but there is a little trickle of sweetness below the top level. A mid-weight smooth, easy-drinking, food friendly wine with a supple mouth-feel; it's solidly backed by fine, unobtrusive tannins. **A very drinkable drop that's driven by pure fruit which delivers excellent power of flavour that just keeps on trucking down the palate;** drink over the next five years; it's rated as Recommended with \*\*\*\* for value.

## Kalleske Clarry's Red 2005...



Deep red in colour with black hints, hinting at the intensity to come. **Very aromatic**, jumbling together aromas of ripe raspberries, dark cherries and berries, with exotic spices and a touch of regional earthiness, very inviting. The nose has **great depth and intensity**. The palate follows through perfectly, it has great intensity, its even a touch syrupy with just **buckets of flavour**. You get loads of intense plummy, spicy berried fruits, and then the mid palate takes over with an intense burst of super ripe raspberries with a hint of liqueur. **The finish is long and intense**, with just the tiniest hint of oak. The 2004 of this wine was a delicious middle weight blend that drank way above its price. **This is something else again**, altogether more intense and 'serious', a much better wine all round, and therefore an even greater bargain! **Lovely stuff.**

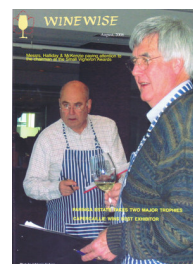

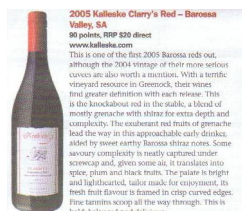


## 2005 Kalleske Clarry's Red – 90 points

This is one of the first 2005 Barossa reds out, although the 2004 vintage of their more serious cuvees are also worth a mention. With a terrific vineyard resource in Greenock, **their wines find greater definition with each release**. This is the knockabout red in the stable, a blend of mostly Grenache with shiraz for extra depth and complexity. The **exuberant red fruits** of Grenache lead the way in this approachable early drinker, aided by sweet earthy Barossa Shiraz notes. Some savoury complexity is neatly captured under screwcap and, given some air, it translates into spice, plum and black fruits. The palate is bright and lighthearted, **tailor made for enjoyment**, its fresh fruit flavour is framed in crisp curved edges. **Fine tannins** scoop all the way through.

A blend of 80% grenache and 20% shiraz from the Kalleske farm located in the Greenock Creek sub-region of the Barossa.

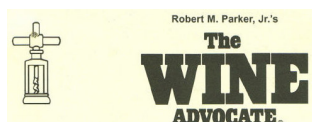
Certified organic too.

This is the very sort of wine Mucho Yummo Wino was invented for. It's not the kind of wine you'd necessarily score highly - but it rates very high in the suck-it-down-fast stakes. **It's just black and smooth and spicy, that mix of sweet and savoury that Barossan-grenache-mixed-with-shiraz does so well.** There's actually a fair amount of tarry aniseed here, and although there is a slight kiss of mint, if it bothers you you're clearly not in the right mood. **A lovely drink.** Imperceptible tannin and acid. Drink: 2006-2007. Score: Not what Mucho Yummo Wino is all about (but arguably 88).

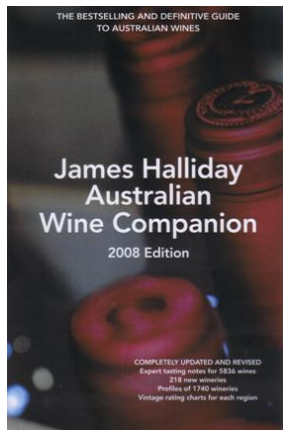
